Message from our Executive Director

This fall I am pleased to tell you about the launch of Harmony House's public service announcement campaign featuring prominent men speaking out against violence against women. This project is the culmination of work undertaken by Harmony House's Social Action Committee over the past several years. In 2007, we hosted a conference of anti-violence activists who identified various strategies to end violence against women. Among them was the idea to get men to speak out to other men and boys regarding their commitment to women's equality and to ending violence against women. We are delighted with the final results. Watch for details on the campaign launch on our website and hopefully you'll see the finished product in local television, radio and print media starting in time for December 6, the national day of action to end violence against women.

I'd like to say a big thank you to all the men who donated their time and their voices to our campaign, including Adam Langlois, our fabulous cameraman.

I am also excited to report on a project our shelter association, the Ontario Association of Interval and Transition Houses (OAITH), hopes to undertake over the next several years. OAITH and member shelters will be working toward greater inclusion of survivors of violence in our work to end violence against women. This, of course, makes perfect sense as women are the experts of their own experiences and can and should lead the

way to ensuring that appropriate resources are in place to effectively help abused women when they need them. This project builds on OAITH's last major project, Women's Voices, which outlined the problems abused women experience in escaping violence and what they would need to become more involved in work to end violence against women.

It is exciting to once again be in an era where progressive work to end violence against women is taking place. I have always believed that **ending** violence against women is an achievable goal in my lifetime and it is the real work of shelters for abused women and our supporters. Thank you to all of you who share this dream and help us make it a reality.

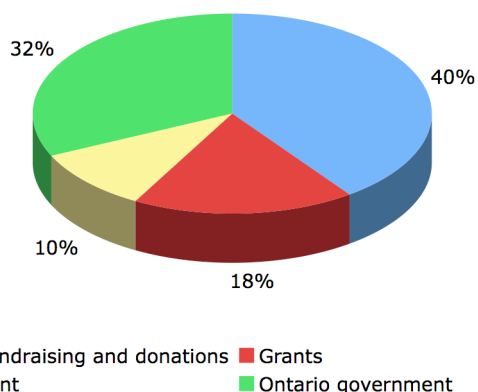

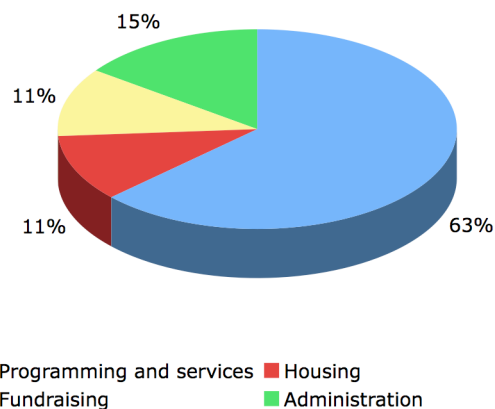
